The Hampton Area Chamber of Commerce was founded as a non-profit in June of 1950 and is still the legal name. Doing business as the Greater Franklin County Chamber of Commerce (GFCCC) was added in 2011 with a focus on benefiting the entire Franklin County businesses and families.

GFCCC is also a Main Street Iowa Community. Hampton has been a Main Street Community since 1991. Chamber and Main Street merged in 2010. The philosophy of the Main Street Iowa Program is to improve the social and economic well-being of Iowa's communities by assisting selected communities to capitalize on the unique identity, assets, and character of their historic commercial district.

The mission of the Chamber and Main Street is to support economic growth by improving the quality of life and business climate in the Franklin County area. This is accomplished through the efforts of Franklin County Tourism and four committees: Economic Vitality, Organization, Promotion, and Design.

A new sub-committee called Main Street Hampton Committee, made up of 7-10 people, is being organized to guide the implementation of the local Main Street program allowing the Chamber board to focus on the county-wide mission of the GFCCC.
